

Fenton Tract Forest Storrs-Mansfield, CT



The 580-acre Fenton Tract is located east of the UConn Storrs campus along the Fenton River and is the largest contiguous parcel of the UConn Forest, which is a multiuse teaching, research, and extension resource managed and coordinated by the Department of Natural Resources and Environment at the University of Connecticut.

Rules and Guidelines:

- No unauthorized motorized vehicles
- Dogs must be on leash at all times
- Park in designated areas only
- Respect private property
- No cutting of trees/shrubs, or collection of firewood
- No campfires—to report a campfire -->





UConn FD Campfire Reporting

- No hunting
- Stay on designated trails per activity type (Blue Nipmuck Trail- hiking only; Other trails Multi-use: hiking, equestrian, cycling)
- Do not create new or modify existing trails
- Stay clear of active forest management. Roads and trails may be temporarily closed to accommodate forest management activities
- Respect and stay clear of ongoing research sites throughout the forest
- Leave no trace pack out what you packed in
- Thank you for helping keep the forest safe and clean for all
